

MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT

For over ten years, Fundación Intellectus has worked to create a healthier Puerto Rico, driven by a commitment to the mental and physical wellbeing of all Puerto Ricans. We believe in a future where our island has enough primary care physicians and specialists to adequately meet the needs of our population; where a diagnosis such as cancer does not mean financial hardship; where scientific research thrives and grows, leading to new and improved therapies to treat and cure health conditions, a future where everyone can achieve good health.

Addressing the shortage of physicians in Puerto Rico is one of the Foundation's highest priorities. One of the most direct ways we address this need is by providing support to medical students who are committed to practicing in Puerto Rico after completing their medical training. Our scholarships, which contribute to tuition costs and support students research in health related fields, represent our investment in the success and commitment of our future doctors.

In the past decade, Fundación Intellectus has awarded \$2,729,261 in scholarships to medical students to help cover their tuition, and \$275,280 in research scholarships to support their work in health related research.

Our programs, in support of health research, aim to drive innovations in science and health care that accelerate progress toward meaningful, impactful solutions. For this reason, we focus on investing in initiatives with high potential to create positive change in the communities they serve. We also support research that aims to close knowledge gaps regarding how diseases affect different populations, particularly the Latino and Puerto Rican communities.

This past year, we supported initiatives such as "Clínica del Sur", which seeks to address the lack of access to healthcare providers in the southern and central mountain region of Puerto Rico. These clinics, staffed by medical students from Ponce Health Sciences University, provide primary care services to underserved communities with limited access to medical care.

As we begin our next decade of work, we do so with a strong foundation on which to continue building. Our track record stands as a testament to our commitment and determination to create a future where health is within everyone's reach.

Addressing the SHORTAGE OF PHYSICIANS IN PUERTO RICO


Throughout 2024, we have continued working to ensure that more young physicians remain in or return to Puerto Rico to practice medicine.

A study commissioned by the Puerto Rico Medical Defense Insurance Co. and conducted by Faro, LLC, shed light on the critical shortage of medical specialists in Puerto Rico and how this shortage could impact the island in the coming years. Our commitment is focused on uniting efforts between the private and public sectors to make practicing medicine in Puerto Rico not just a dream for many young doctors, but an achievable reality.


This is why Fundación Intellectus awards scholarships to help cover tuition costs for outstanding Puerto Rican medical students enrolled in the island's four main medical schools.



MD PHSU SCHOLARSHIP

FUNDS AWARDED: \$192,326

IMPACT: 10 STUDENTS

The MD PHSU Scholarship provides financial support to talented Puerto Rican students pursuing their medical degree at Ponce Health Sciences University. Intellectus awards a financial contribution of \$22,500, distributed by semester, to support their tuition payments.

The future of healthcare in Puerto Rico depends on more young individuals choosing and succeeding in professional careers in science and health.

That's why part of our annual scholarship budget is dedicated to supporting high school students who wish to attend specialized science summer camps, as well as college students preparing to take the MCAT exam required for their medical school application.

HEALTH RESEARCH SCHOLARSHIP

"The Intellectus scholarship has been a cornerstone in my development as a future physician-scientist, providing me with the resources to advance my research on innovative cancer immunotherapies (CAR-NK cell therapy) and generate findings with the potential to transform access to advanced treatments in underserved communities. This support has brought me closer to my mission of developing cutting edge therapeutic platforms that can be implemented in Puerto Rico."



RESEARCH PROJECT: ENGINEERING NATURAL KILLER CELLS FOR UNIVERSAL CELLULAR THERAPIES AGAINST CANCER.

"Cancer remains a pressing concern in Puerto Rico, with an alarming increase of 347.6 cases and 100.7 deaths per 100,000 inhabitants. This crisis is further exacerbated by the high prevalence of aggressive cancers such as breast, prostate, colorectal, and lung cancer. Unfortunately, inequality in access to advanced treatments, compounded by socioeconomic barriers and geographic limitations, prevents many Puerto Ricans from receiving the urgent care they need.

In response to this urgent need, our research offers a ray of hope by integrating the fields of oncology and immunology to develop NK cell based therapies for cancer. What sets this approach apart is its potential to be both cost effective and universally applicable. This is not just an addition to the current arsenal of cancer treatments; it has the potential to transform the way cancer is treated. Our "off-the-shelf" therapy concept aims to overcome the limitations of patient specific treatments. By creating a standardized approach capable of targeting various types of cancer, we aim to lower production and treatment costs. This would ensure that even those living in resource limited settings or facing financial hardship can access life saving therapies."

PREVENTION IS KEY

Health is the foundation of everything. When people are healthy, they can focus on building a better future for themselves and their families. We work with medical professionals, organizations, and institutions to improve and expand access to healthcare services in underserved areas.





Support for the ProSOLEAR study (Study of Life Experiences, Adversity and Resilience), which focuses on the effects of adversity in pregnant women. This study is part of the Pediatric Outcomes of Prenatal Zika Exposure project.

Ponce Medical School Foundation Dermatology Residency

\$7,690

Donation awarded for the acquisition of research equipment to carry out a pioneering research study on skin color classification in Hispanic populations.

Ponce Medical School Foundation "Clínica del Sur " \$15,000

Multi-year donation to support the operational expenses of the Student Run Free Clinics at "Clínica del Sur," a mobile community clinic offering integrated medical services to underserved communities in the southern region of Puerto Rico. These clinics provide multidisciplinary clinical training experiences for first through fourth year medical students while delivering vital healthcare services in areas with limited access to medical providers.

Ponce Medical School Foundation "Clínica del Sur" Student Run Free Clinics

Since January 2023, the Student Run Free Clinics have made the following impact through their free community clinics:

- 16 clinics organized and led by students
- 546 patients served
- 157 patients received psychological services
- Student volunteers participated in over 20 health fairs and community education events.

The volunteer team includes:

- 98 medical students
- 28 psychology students
- 56 nursing students
- 10 public health students
- 17 physicians, including specialists in dermatology, otolaryngology, and pediatrics.

"During our community outreach through "Clínica del Sur", we have witnessed an alarming healthcare landscape in Puerto Rico. There is a growing number of patients with poorly controlled chronic conditions such as hypertension and diabetes. Many arrive without taking their medications regularly, and others have normalized living with h

medications regularly, and others have normalized living with high blood sugar or blood pressure levels, clear signs of a troubling lack of health education. Additionally, every clinic reveals a high need for psychological services, reflecting the emotional and mental toll faced by our communities. While many of our patients are older adults, we recently participated in a clinic where we treated young individuals showing signs of serious medical conditions such as thyroid disorders, immune system issues, hypertension, and anxiety. This experience underscores the limited medical attention many people receive from an early age and reinforces the urgent need to expand access to healthcare and preventive education across the Island."


